 - Network coordination centre for Internet number resources
 - Perform secretariat duties on behalf of the RIPE community
 - Enable the technical coordination of the Internet infrastructure
 - Ensure neutrality and impartiality
 - Provide a consistent contact point



- Independent, not-for-profit, bottom-up membership organisation
- Anyone can become a member

- Funded by members, fully autonomous

- Offices in Amsterdam, Dubai and Moscow
 - Around 130 staff members

- Outreach, tools, measurements, training and more!





The Five RIRs






- Services for members: IP Analyser






IPv6 and RIPE NCC Membership





% of ASes Announcing IPv6




Global: 18.26% CIS: 10.97% Azerbaijan: 38.24%
